CCO is offering this program in partnership with Oxford Brookes University. Oxford Brookes has been a leading provider of postgraduate education for coaching supervisors since 2006. This is a unique program offering a highly collaborative learning experience and flexibility in terms of course structure. The program is designed for experienced coaches and participants will be invited to engage with a high level overview and critical analysis of the coaching field that will enable them to take their practice to a new level. The full program comprises four stages, three of which are optional.

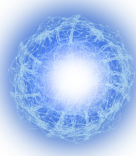

COURSE STRUCTURE

STAGE 1

Includes two months preparation followed by an intensive period of online seminars and face-to-face workshops. The preparation phase includes reading, reflection, peer supervision and supervision practice. Participants should deliver at least one supervision session for a volunteer coach before the workshop. The preparation phase is followed by a series of online seminars and a face-to-face group supervision workshop. Participants are encouraged to experiment in order to identify their own model and style of supervision. Upon completion of stage 1 participants will receive a **Certificate of Attendance**.

STAGE 2

Requires undertaking two x 90 minute sessions of individual supervision with the program facilitators, beginning after the intensive workshop. These sessions provide participants with the opportunity to receive individual developmental feedback on their model of coaching supervision in practice.

STAGE 3

Is a written assignment outlining the participant's model of coaching supervision. Upon successful completion of stage 2 and 3 participants will receive the **Professional Certificate of Advanced Study in Coaching Supervision**.

STAGE 4

Consists of an additional assessment, including a written portfolio with the participant's analysis of two video/audio types - one of their 'best' sessions and one of their 'worst'. Upon completion of stage 4, participants will be accredited as a coaching supervisor by Oxford Brookes University.

Stages 2 - 4 are all optional. Stage 2 is organised and administered in Australia. Stages 3 and 4 are administered by the International Centre for Coaching and Mentoring Studies at Oxford Brookes University. Fees for stages 2, 3 and 4 are available via the Oxford Brookes University online shop. Participants intending to undertake stages 2 - 4 are advised to do so within two years of completing stage 1.

This will be our third offering of the Oxford Brookes Coaching Supervision program in Australia/Asia Pacific. CCO has entered into partnership with Oxford Brookes University to offer the program on an ongoing basis. Local facilitators, all of whom have been through the program themselves and are experienced coach supervisors, will be joined by visiting faculty from Oxford Brookes. Oxford Brookes hosts coaching supervision conferences and colloquiums in the UK to which all program graduates are invited to attend.
